

Sample resolution/motion for Parliaments for the 2015 Review Conference of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty

The parliament of [];

Affirming the common aspiration of parliaments, governments and civil society to achieve the peace and security of a nuclear-weapon-free world;

Concerned that on January 22, 2015 the *Doomsday Clock* was shifted to three minutes to midnight, indicating increased risks of nuclear proliferation and the catastrophic consequences of a potential use of nuclear weapons by accident, miscalculation or intent;

Welcoming the resolution adopted by the 130th Assembly of the Inter Parliamentary Union on March 20, 2014 in which member parliaments agreed to work with governments to eliminate the role of nuclear weapons in security doctrines and commence negotiations on a nuclear weapons convention or package of agreements to abolish nuclear weapons globally;

Commending the government of Austria for hosting the *Third International Conference on the Humanitarian Impact of Nuclear Weapons* on Dec 8-9, 2014, and the 157 other countries that attended the conference including the government of [];

Welcoming global indications of support for a nuclear weapon-free world including the actions on the first International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons on September 26, 2014, and the *Living Peace statement* adopted by Nobel Peace Laureates on December 14, 2014;

Highlighting the importance of the 2015 Review Conference of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons to be held at the United Nations from April 27 – May 22, 2015 as a forum for governments to commit to, and commence, deliberations and negotiations for the global abolition of nuclear weapons;

Calls on the government of [] to place top priority on its participation in the 2015 NPT Review Conference, and to engage with other States Parties, parliamentarians and civil society representatives to ensure a successful outcome to the conference.
